Every Collector of taxes for school purposes to give two sufficient securities in double the amount to be collected

That from and after the passing of this Bye Law it shall be the duty of every Collector to furnish Bonds of equal tenor with those furnished for the just and proper payment of all other Rates and Taxes within the District with two sufficient securities in double the amount to be collected by him for school purposes which Bond shall be made to the District Council in their Corporate Capacity, for all monies collected by him

A Bye Law to provide for the more efficient Assessing of the various Townships in the District of Victoria

Whereas it is expedient to alter the mode now in use of assessing the various Townships in order to afford School Trustees and others convenient opportunities for carrying out the Laws lately enacted by the Parliament of this Province

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the District of Victoria by virtue of an act passed in the Parliament of Canada in the 4th & 5th years of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria entitled an act to provide for the establishment of Local and municipal authorities in that part of the Province formerly called Upper Canada

1 - That from and after the passing of this Bye Law it shall be the duty of each and every Assessor of any Township within the District of Victoria to assess the Inhabitants of their various Townships by School Sections and to make

Every assessor to assess the inhabitants by School Sections

their returns to the proper Officer for making out the Collector's Rolls so as to enable him without difficulty to assess all rates upon the Inhabitants in School Sections beginning at & one and finishing with the highest N^o of the School Sections in such Township

assessor for neglecting to make his return accord to this Bye Law to forfeit one half of his fees

To receive one fifth more for the additional duty

2nd That any assessor failing to make his Assessment and return according to this Bye Law shall forfeit one half of his fees as Assessor

3rd That for the additional labor thus given Each Assessor shall be entitled to one fifth of the amount of fees otherwise to be paid

Bye Law 32
A Bye Law for the regulating of and compounding for Statute Labor

The District Council of the Victoria District enact by virtue and under the authority of an act entitled An act to Amend the Laws relative to District Councils in Upper Canada.

That from and after the passing of this Bye Law every person included or inserted in or upon the assessment Roll of any Township reputed Township or Place shall in proportion to the estimate of his real and personal property stated in the said Roll be held liable to work on the Highway and of Statute Labor required and Roads in each and every year as follows from each person accord to his assessed property

And Be it further enacted that Persons liable to do statute labor any person liable to perform statute Labor on the Highway may compound for such duty if he or they think fit by paying to the overseer or Pathmaster of his division the sum of Two shillings for and in lieu of each day's duty or labor respectively at the time and in the manner directed by this Bye Law

And Be it further enacted that the money which shall be paid to any such overseer or Pathmaster shall be expended by him on his division under the directions of the District Fournellers of the Fournship

And be it further enacted that any person having once agreed to compound for his statute labor shall be held to pay the same and failing to make payment within ten days after demand he shall be liable upon the information of the Pathmaster made before any Magistrate to a fine in double the sum of the commutation money beside being liable for all costs

Be it further enacted That for all purposes of this Bye Law it shall be held to be sufficient that the name of the delinquent is on the Pathmaster's List to prove his liability to pay and the production of such list shall be held to be valid testimony - and that in all matters of fine the amount shall be levied by Distress Warrant issued to some Constable who shall by said Warrant be directed to

2nd Be it further enacted that the Clerk of the Peace be and he is hereby directed to levy the same and place the tax so assessed on the respective Rolls of the various Collectors of the Townships
