Invitation from Superintendent of Thurlow to attend Annual School demonstration.

The Warden laid on the Table an invitation from the Superintendent of Education for Thurlow, to the members of the County Council to attend their annual School Demonstration.

Motion by Mr Bradshaw that By-Law to provide for construction of certain roads be read a third time

Mr Bradshaw moved, seconded by Mr Appleby that the By-Law intitled "A. By-Law to provide for the construction of certain Roads in the County of Hastings, and to provide means for the paying for the same, be read a third time and passed. On which the Yeas and Nays were demanded.

Yeas and Nays demanded

By-Law to provide for construction of roads be read a third time by 8 to 5.

of Rawdon. Also a petition from W. H. Kelso
and others, praying for a grant of Money to level
a hill on Lot No 17 in the first Concession of Rawdon.
And also a petition from Stephen Watson which
the Council could not take into Consideration

The report was read as follows

£50.00 to be granted on Application of B.
Flint for Road in Hungerford
and Elzevir.

1st Resolved - That on the application of
Billa Flint Esq the sum of Fifty pounds be granted
to the Township of Hungerford, provided that an
additional sum of twenty five pounds be raised
by subscription, and the whole to be laid out for
the improvement and cutting out of a certain Road
leading from Felix Gabourie's in the eleventh Concession
of Hungerford, being on the forty feet allowance
for road, between Lots number 12 and 13 or as near
thereto as may be practicable in the 12th 13th and 14th
Concession, thence across N^o 1 and part of N^o 2
in the 4th Concession of Elzevir to Hell's Gate on
the Scotomatto River, on the line laid down and
nearly cut out by Billa Flint Esq.

£25.00 to be granted for cutting down
hill in 1st Concession and Petition
of W. H. Hulse

2nd Resolved - That the sum of Twenty five
pounds be granted and paid on the warrant of
Peter Weaver and Charles Mc Kee, hereby appointed
Commissioners for the purpose of levelling a large
hill situated in front of lot number seven teen
in the first Concession of Rawdon on the Town
line and prayed for by Petition from W. H. Hulse
and others

£11.10.0 to Mr Romblough Prov. Surveyor
for establishing boundary line
in Hungerford, conditionally

3rd Resolved - That the sum of Eleven
pounds ten shillings be paid Mr Romblough,
Provincial Land Surveyor, towards defraying the
expenses of the Survey and establishing the line
between the third and fourth Concession of Hungerford,
provided that a similar amount be paid by the
Township Council, and the individuals interested
along said line,

£25.00 to be granted to improve road from
Downing's Mills to Hastings Hill of

4th Resolved - That the sum of Twenty five
pounds be laid out for the improvement of
the Road from Downing's Mills to the
Village

Village of Hastings in Madoc and that the same be expended under the Superintendence of John A. Petcheson Esquire

6th Resolved - That the sum of Fourteen pounds six shillings and ten pence be paid Thompson & Co of Toronto for Assessment and Collectors Polls.

£ 14.5.0 to J. Dape. Cleaning &c.

7th Resolved - That the sum of Fourteen pounds five shillings be paid James Dape for the Cleaning of the Court House and washing for prisoners, from December 1853 to the first of August instant.

£ 25.0.0 on Road from Marmora to Belmont.

8th Resolved - That the sum of Twenty five pounds be expended on the Road leading from the Marmora Iron works to the Township line of Belmont.

£ 25.0.0 to be granted to aid in building Bridge at Fetterly's in Rawdon.

9th Resolved - That the sum of Twenty five pounds be granted to aid in building a Bridge across the Maria River near Fetterly's Mill in the thirteenth Concession of Rawdon as the Township Council of Rawdon has already granted their amount to be applied on said Bridge

Yeas and Nays on 1st Resolution

The first Resolution being read a second time for adoption, the Yeas and nays were demanded,

1st Resolution carried by 9 to 2.

So it was read and adopted in the affirmative.

The second resolution being read a second time for adoption, the Yeas and nays were demanded thereon

So that it was adopted in the affirmative.

Yeas and Nays on 3rd Resolution

The third Resolution being read a second time for adoption, the Yeas and Nays were demanded

3rd Resolution carried by 8 to 3.

Yeas, Messrs Appleby, Bradshaw, Baker, Champion, Frizzell, Flint, Graham and Kerr. — .8
Nays Messrs Bird, Gilbert and Phillips. — .3
So it was adopted in the affirmative.

Resolutions 4, to 7 adopted.

The fourth, fifth, sixth, and seventh resolutions, being read a second time, agreed to and adopted.

The eighth resolution being read a second time, the Yeas and Nays were demanded.

So that it was adopted in the affirmative.

Yeas and Nays on 9th Resolution.

The ninth resolution being read a second time for adoption, the Yeas and nays were demanded.

9th Resolution carried by 7 to 4.

Yeas, Messrs Bradshaw, Baker, Champion, Frizzell, Flint, Graham and Kerr. — .7
Nays, Messrs Appleby, Bird, Gilbert and Phillips. — .4

Report adopted in full.

The report of the whole on ways and means was adopted in full.

County Surveyor to decide upon site for Bridge at Fetterly's. Said Bridge to be a County Bridge.

Mr Baker moved, seconded by Mr Kerr, that the County Surveyor do examine the River and decide upon the site for the Bridge, about to be built at or near Fetterly's Mills, in the thirteenth Concession of the Township of Rawdon, and that the said Bridge be a County Bridge. — Carried

Adjourned to First Tuesday in September

Surveyor reports on proposed boundary
Road between Rawdon & Seymour

Gentlemen, I have examined the proposed road on the boundary line, between Rawdon and Seymour through part of the third and fourth Concessions, and estimate the Cost of the same as follows, that is to say.

Estimate of Cost.

20 rods of Cross way at $\frac{25}{100}$	£ 5.0.0
99 " " " " " upon stringers at $\frac{37}{100}$	37.2.6
A Bridge including 17 rods of Bridging	150.0.0
Leveling hill	37.17.6
	£ 230.0.0
