MESSAGE FROM DESERONTO TOWN COUNCIL – 2008 BUDGET

A municipal budget is a huge task for any Council. The municipality's standard requirements, long-term goals, and economic development must be considered when developing the budget. Also, it is appropriate to aim for a balanced budget, and it is anticipated that for the first time since 1998 Deseronto will be free of any provincial assistance. This financial independence gives many more opportunities to a municipality.

A five-year budget was also developed for greater efficiency and effectiveness. The Town's new website shows the budget and other significant documents, and Council will continue to make every effort to keep people informed and maintain transparency. As part of the five-year budgeting and cost-cutting process there was restructuring of Town departments, staff reduction (with retirement costs examined over several years), and planning for the replacement of aging equipment such as snow clearing and fire fighting vehicles. The latter provide considers better service to all and cost reductions in

Unfortunately, the effects of the Culbertson Tract Land Claim have greatly impacted on development and economic initiatives within the Town. Without notable economic growth, dramatically rising operating costs must be carried by the existing tax base. Council has sought to lower operating costs, and address challenges faced by the Municipality, but it was necessary to implement a tax increase of 6% for 2008. Other surrounding municipalities also had increases, such as Napanee at 5.6%.

Council continues to address many additional issues on a daily basis. The aging water and sewer system requires major investment to meet the day-to-day needs of residents and business. Unfortunately, Deseronto's \$3,000,000 application to a recent province-wide infrastructure program to address some of the issues with the waste water plant was not approved. Despite the setback, Council will continue to pursue any future additional funding opportunities for water and sewer improvements. A rate analysis is also underway to determine how the Municipality can address both water conservation and the self-sustainability of the system (required by provincial legislation). People can help reduce costs and increase the sustainability of the system by conserving water, and ensuring that their downspouts and sub-pumps are not being directed into sewer lines.

The Town is seeing results from the "pay per call" system that it adopted with the OPP (Tyendinaga Township does this as well). Basically, the municipality pays for only those services provided and each issue/call addressed. While no one should ever hesitate to call the police if required, if the number of calls drops, so do policing costs, so Council is currently reviewing opportunities which may provide services that augment those of the OPP at a significantly lower cost. It is important to bear in mind that it is unlikely that: a) the OPP can be replaced entirely and, b) that the municipality does not pay for police costs associated with the land claim.

With increased costs for waste disposal and environmental concerns, garbage bag tags were increased to \$2.00, effective July 1, 2008. Bag tags can be purchased at Town Hall or at Downtown Variety, Quinte Variety & Video, and Sunrise Variety. Council also cancelled this year's special waste day which saved about \$12,000. Council wishes to promote the need to "reduce, re-use and recycle". Recycling and composting reduces waste collection fees, as well as the amount of waste in landfill sites, whereas garbage collected is charged to the municipality and ratepayer. If you have large items or inefficient household appliances to be disposed of, please contact the Town Hall. Some businesses in Town will pick up large items or re-use or scrap metal and provincial programs also exist.

The Town of Deseronto continues to pursue and receive major grants to support initiatives for economic development and transit. This includes grants from: Trenval Business Development Corporation; the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA); Hastings County; Prince Edward - Lennox Addington Social Services (PELASS); and the John M. Parrott



Foundation. This funding covers the bulk of these programs, and in the near future you will notice some notable positive developments—an environmentally friendly transit vehicle, a logo branding and marketing strategy, and streetscape improvements to promote downtown. We encourage residents to shop locally and ride the transit for work, appointments, any other needs, and for the benefit of the environment.

Council and the Town of Deseronto would like to thank you for your support and patience during challenging times, the many volunteers who donate numerous hours enhancing our Town (about 300 at the recent volunteer appreciation event), and wish you a safe and fun summer.

DESERONTO ARCHIVES - "Almost a fairy tale": Deseronto, 1881

A mention in the Napanee Standard of April 7, 1881, led former Deseronto archivist. Ken Brown, on a detective trail to hunt down a published description of 'Deseronto, Ont. and its industries'. The article in question appeared in the journal The Lumber World, published in Buffalo, New York, in 1881. This publication proved difficult to find, but eventually it was established that the Hagley Library in Wilmington, Delaware, held a copy. This library specialises in collecting the records of American enterprise (and is based on the site of the original DuPont gunpowder factory). The staff very kindly furnished Deseronto Archives with a copy of the article.



'Deseronto, Ont. and its Industries' runs to seven pages and is handsomely illustrated with etchings of some of the principal industrial buildings of the town: the saw mill, sash and door factory, flour mill, cedar mill and steamboat wharf. The text is fulsome in its praise of the Rathbun Company, whose business interests and activities defined the town at that time. Here are a few extracts:

- Were Deseronto, and its location, in the United States, it would achieve fame as a summer resort; as it is, it has become a hive of industry, and it is questionable if we in this country have any place of like size to compare with it. [p.31]
- The original saw mill has given place to one of immense proportions; extensive machine and blacksmith shops; sash and door factories; cedar mills; flour mills; lines of steam and sailing vessels; commodious and extensive warehouses and docks have been called into being, and, so great has become the importance of Deseronto as a shipping centre, the United States government has established there a Consular Agency. [p.32]

The total number of vessels which sailed from Mill Point (Deseronto) loaded by or for the firm alone, during the season of

navigation beginning March 31, 1880 and ending November 20, 1880, was 509, of which 300 cleared for United States, and 209 for Canada ports. This does not include passenger steamers. During the season of navigation it is not an unusual sight to see from fifteen to seventeen vessels loading at the Deseronto docks simultaneously. [p.35]

The article provides a fascinating glimpse into the industries and activities of Deseronto in the year that the town received its new name. Call into the Archives if you'd like to read more! 





CELEBRATING OUR UNITY - By Paul Robertson, Chair, Love in Action

A spirit of unity and fellowship descended upon Deseronto on the beautiful Sunday evening of 8 June. About 80 people gathered in Centennial Park for a celebration of spoken word, dance, and choral and instrumental music presented by individuals and organizations from Deseronto, Tyendinaga Township and Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory.

Organized by Love in Action, an outreach group based in Tyendinaga MT, the event was designed to provide a forum where residents of the three communities could gather to celebrate and reaffirm the common bonds that unite the people of this region.



Negative images of the town and surrounding area reported in news items about the land claim protests inspired Love in Action members to organize the evening. The event was intended to help counter people's frustration and bring together natives and non-natives in a peaceful, non-political, and non-judgmental environment.

Councillor Edgar Tumak, dressed as an English nobleman of 1700 dazzled the crowd with a rendition of a Baroque-era dance known as the Union, written to commemorate the union of England and Scotland in 1707-a time of uncertainty between those nations, and a time when an enduring bond was created with the Mohawk people and the Crown. Among the presenters were choral groups from the Anglican Parish of Tyendinaga, Deseronto United Church, and the Quinte Singers, Ken and Barbara Gail Brant of the country gospel group The Mohawk Messangers, and fiddle and keyboard duo Marg Anderson and Laurie Perry of Belleville.
