## Appendix.

Report  
County Roads and Bridges in 1909.

To the Honorable and Members of the County Council,  
Gentlemen:-

Herewith we beg to submit Report of work done and expenditures made on County Roads and Bridges in 1909.

As pointed out to you a year ago the roads approved by order in Council of 1908 were numbered, Fairing Bellville as the radiating point, and the schedule number is given as well as the designation usually known by the Council. On the accompanying schedule which with your approval will be submitted to the Government, is shown the nature of improvement, the number of rods improved, number of culverts built and cost of each section.

No 1. on Schedule, approved roads.

Bellville to Trenton. The greater portion of this road has been fairly well graded. Some 500 rods were re-surfaced with good gravel, stone for crushing cannot be had only by long hauls.

No 2 - Bellville to Frankford. This road along R. & P. and across 2nd and 3rd Concessions was flat; the sides were removed, a nice crown formed and is now in good condition.

No 4. Marmora Road. As stated last year this road needed grading; about 23 rods has been crowned and re-surfaced, part with crushed stone and the remainder with gravel.

No 5. Frankford to Sterling. The sides were removed, and road bed re-surfaced with gravel.

No 6. A. Trent Road. This was also graded and some gravel placed on where needed.

- No 3. A. Aiken's Church to Box S. 34. The sides were taken off in 3rd and 4th Succession. This part of the road now has a good surface; a new culvert of concrete was built. As the formen become used to cement, the style of culvert will take the place of the old stone culvert with wood cover.
- No 11. see B. C. + D. Madoe Road. About 2600 rods were graded & resurfaced with some 3000 yards of crushed stone & gravel. Ten culverts were built.
- No. 12. Tweed Road. The southern part has a large amount of heavy travel, and some 1200 yds of broken stone was placed on the surface and the sides removed; further north some grading was done & surface finished with gravel.
- No. 13. Belleville to Richmond Laundry. This road and generally the roads in Lyndinaga, viz Nos. 17, 18, 19, 22, 24, 25, 27 + 28 were flat and nearly all the work on these roads consisted of grading and removing sides. Eleven new culverts were built.
- No 30. Mankauk to Stoco. Some grading done and re-surfaced with gravel.
- No. 32. North from Thomasburg. 425 rods were graded and gravelled.
- No 34. Tweed to Gordon's Cavers. The eastern end graded and surface gravelled.
- No. 36. + 38. - 300 rods of grading & re-surfacing with gravel. Two new culverts.
- No 39. Madoe to Mammora Billage. From Mammora Str. to Billage about 400 rods were graded and crown gravelled. Five new culverts.
- No 40. Ridge Road. Re-surfaced with gravel & two new culverts built.
- No 41. Ridge road to Benson's. Nearly 1000 yards of gravel placed on north end.

- No. 42. Harrod to Seymour. 350 yards of crushed stone placed on surface.
- No 43. Steiling to Millman's Corners. At the western end of village the street was re-surfaced, with crushed stone to a width of 20 feet and further north Crown gravelled, and three new culverts built.
- No 45. Madoe village to Cooper. 8th Con. re-surfaced with gravel. One culvert built.
