A significant new accession

It has been a little like Christmas here in the Community Archives over the last week, as we have been busy sorting through a large shipment of records received from the family of Sir Gilbert Parker.

The Parkers moved to Frankford in the 1870s, where Gilbert got his first job in Ruliff Grass's general store. He went on to become a schoolteacher, teaching at Marsh Hill and Bayside schools, and then at the Ontario Institute for the Deaf and Dumb (now the Sir James Whitney School for the Deaf).

Parker left the field of education to enter the church, but left the

Bay of Quinte in 1886 for a round-the-world tour, which included a stint as a journalist at the *Sydney Morning Herald* in Australia. He settled in London, England, where he became a successful writer of fiction, with Canada as his main subject. He published several novels, some of which were turned into plays and silent movies.



In 1900, Parker was elected as MP for Gravesend in Kent, a position he held for 18 years. He was knighted in 1901 by Edward VII, and became a baronet in 1915, in recognition of his role in distributing pro-war propaganda to the American people. Parker died in London in 1932 and his body was sent home to Belleville to be buried. His personal records, however, remained in London for many years, until his neice, Kathleen, shipped them to California. Her son has now transferred the containers to the Community Archives, all 15 trunks and boxes, with a total weight of 650lbs!

The boxes contained personal and political scrapbooks, literary manuscripts and financial papers. We will be spending the next few weeks processing these materials and adding them to our online catalogue at http://discover.cabhc.ca/.


