CCUPYING a situation of remarkable beauty where the River Moira has its confluence with the Bay of Quinte, the City of Belleville, Ontario, holds a position of surpassing commercial and industrial advantage and is the centre of one of the finest sporting and recreation districts in America.

The picturesque Bay of Quinte forms the waterfront while to the north many hundreds of Laurentian lakes with their spring-fed streams provide a natural paradise for the hunter and angler.

Delightful drives over paved highways in all directions bring to view many supremely charming landscapes. Many thousands of tourists and parties annually visit Belleville and enjoy the manifold attractions for those in search of rest and recreation.

Belleville, because of its strategic position, about midway between Toronto, Hamilton and London, the three largest cities of Western Ontario, and Ottawa, Montreal and Quebec, the three greatest centres of population in Eastern Canada, is an ideal location for manufacturing enterprises.

Fifty thriving industries are located in the Belleville area, a large proportion of which are branches of American manufacturing corporations. Six of those so represented are the largest of their kind in the world.

In its civic development, Belleville has sought to maintain a high standard of cultural life, with clean and wholesome conditions amidst which to establish a home or rear a family. Educational and recreational facilities are of the best. BELLEVILLE'S ACCESSIBILITY

The trunk lines of the two great transcontinental railways pass through the corporation bounds with additional radiating lines to Madoc, Bancroft, Peterborough, Picton, Ottawa and all intervening towns, cities and villages. Belleville is the main divisional point on the Canadian National between Toronto and Montreal and has the most commodious roundhouse in Canada. Seven bus lines operate from the city including coast to coast service.

PICTURESQUE WATER ROUTES AND BEAUTIFUL DRIVES

The Bay of Quinte and the Trent and Murray Canals afford picturesque and convenient water routes to all ports on the Great Lakes as well as to the Kawartha Lake system and the marvellous panorama of the Trent Valley. Government highways lead to summer resorts and points of interest and beauty among which are the Sand Banks, Lakeon-the-Mountain, Bon Echo and Oak Lake. Pic-

The black bass is here found at its gamiest and best and the salmon trout is almost equally prolific of good returns while the speckled brook trout inhabits the many hundreds of crystal-clear streams that course down from the

OUINTE BEACHES OF BELLEVILLE

The citizens of Belleville have now entered upon a comprehensive scheme to develop the waterfront along the northern shore of the Bay of Quinte. The improvements will comprise a broad driveway and boulevard extending from the Government Dock to the easterly bounds of the city. A new bathing oeach will be formed where there will be ample accommodation for the many thousands who will desire to take part in this form of recreation. The waters of the Bay of Quinte have an exceedingly agreeable temperature in the warmer months as contrasted with the beaches along Lake Ontario where cold water makes bathing impractical at certain periods of the summer. The waterfront will be suitably decorated with shrubbery and planted at convenient intervals with ornamental trees. The entire scheme will require several years for its full development ,but the bathing beach and other essential features will be open to the public in the summer of 1937.

The poultry feeding and poultry dressing departments hold a great deal of fascination for the visitor. Methods used in these departments are the very latest developments of scientific research.

In January, 1935, the Company entered into a new field of operation, namely the hatching of baby chicks. The hatchery building is entirely separated from the rest of the plant and is equipped with the finest of incubators and chick brooding equipment available. The purpose of the hatchery is not only to increase the poultry population in the district but to improve it. A great deal of time and money is spent each year in flock culling, blood testing and the selection of male birds. Larger and more profitable production of poultry means a larger income for poultry producers, and this in turn means a larger volume of business for local merchants.







J. & J. CASH, Inc., Belleville, is the Canadian Branch of the American Company of the same name, with headquarters at S. Norwalk, Conn. The American Company is affiliated with the English firm of J. & J. Cash Limited, Coventry, which can claim the distinction of being one of the oldest British industries. Started by John and Joseph Cash, nearly a century ago, the Company originally were large ribbon manufacturers. In the earlier years all Cash's Ribbon was made by home weavers. Seeing homework wasteful and unwieldy, Cash's built a colony of 48 houses around the present factory site. The upper stories of the houses were used as factory space for weaving and the downstairs for living quarters for the workers.

Claiming that this social-minded venture was spoiling labour, the conservative English trade boycotted Cash's ribbon, which threatened to close down the business. Hearing of

this state of affairs, the head of one of the largest New York Department Stores, later to become Wanamakers announced he would buy nothing but Cash's ribbon. The news travelling to England quickly broke up the boycott.

Prosperity continued during the 1860's, but the lowering of the tariff on French ribbon in 1871 killed off many of the English Ribbon concerns and would have done the same for I. & I. Cash, had it not been for the ingenuity of the management in turning to the manufacture of Frilling, yards of which were used at the time in every woman's petticoat. As it had once been famous as a Ribbon producer, the company soon won fame as a manufacturer of Frilling.

In 1886, it was brought to the notice of the management that a good business could be built up in the weaving of Name labels.

The development of this idea progressed to such an extent that at the present day woven Names and Labels constitute the sole products of the Company.

The American plant was started in 1906 and incorporated in 1919. The Belleville mill was established in 1919 and one in Los Angeles in 1926.

The people who live away from home, those who do considerable travelling, those who send their children away to school and to Nurses, Cash's Woven Names have come to be a necessity. Dry Goods Stores, Department Stores and Men's Furnishings throughout Canada take orders for the Names.



Mayors, Reeves, Aldermen, Councillors and men of influence in the various municipalities have vied with one another in the protection of our natural heritage of beautiful lakes, wooded areas and wild life—our governments have provided artificial aids to Nature and have filled our streams with fish to delight the heart of Isaac Walton guests and neighbours

from the South.

Here is the key and with it the freedom of our beautiful County of Hastings. May your stay with us be happy.

TO THE INDUSTRIALIST:

The City of Belleville offers rare opportunities for the location of plants, main or branch, and the absence of industrial upheavals so prevalent at this time. Belleville has yet to know what a strike means and present indications are that it never will, in a major sense at any rate, for the relationship of employer and employee in our various plants is on a high plane. One of our largest industrial employers speaks favourably of a union formed within his plant without outside influence. This union elects its committee who treats with the management on all matters pertaining to the welfare of the staff, including working conditions, hours of labour, wages, etc. By a spirit of co-opera-

tion and frankness on the part of all parties a frame of mind has been engendered that bids fair to achieve permanent contentment and mutual material gain. This plant employs male and female labour and is a cross section of the city's employables reflecting favourably the industrious material available in the City of Belleville for any Industrialists who might be seeking a locaton for his plant where reasonable expectation of relief from industrial upheaval exists.

Unemployed men of our city cheerfully give service in return for relief afforded their families and there is not a city in the province for relief administration as particularly indicated by a sharply declining relief roll and diminishing cost of this service.

The eye of any discerning industrialists from the South seeking a location is particularly directed to the foregoing which coupled with a plentiful labour supply and low-powered costs plus a preferential position in bidding for the markets of the British Empire (see British Preference Tariff) some five hundred millions of souls should prove deciding points in favour of a British Empire location and that location Belleville.

Ontario School for the Deaf

Established in 1870, this school continues to provide a suitable education for boys and girls who are deaf, or who have insufficient hearing to enable them to make progress in a public or separate school.

TERMS OF ADMISSION AND COST.

Any boy or girl in Ontario, between the ages of five and twenty-one years, who is totally or partially deaf, and who would be eligible to attend a public or separate school, if he or she were not deaf, may attend the Ontario School for the Deaf. All pupils must be free from any mental or physical defect other than deafness, that would prevent them from caring for themselves in the Residence and in the School.

Parents or guardians must arrange for transportation to and from the School and buy all necessary clothing. They are also required to pay \$50.00 per annum for each child to help defray the cost of food and sustenance. The balance of more than \$400.00 per annum, which is necessary to maintain a child is assumed by the Province of Ontario. If parents are financially unable to pay the fee for food and sustenance, they may submit a remission of fees form signed by the mayor or reeve of the municipality in which they live and exemption may be granted. In such cases the municipality does not

assume any financial obligation as the total cost is paid by the Province.

For the present school year the average attendance is 292, the pupils coming from all parts of Ontario. Forty-five boys and girls are spending their first year at the School. Of these, twenty-one were under seven years of age, when admirted

seven years of age, when admitted.

The School is organized into three sections, namely: Junior, Intermediate and Senior.

THE JUNIOR SCHOOL.

In the Junior School boys and girls between the approximate ages of five and eleven are grouped in regular grades of twelve pupils to a class, each in charge of a class teacher. Instruction is given in language, lip-reading, and oral speech as well as in the fundamentals of silent reading, writing, spelling, composition, arithmetic, and other fundamental subjects.

THE INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL.

Pupils between the approximate ages of eleven and fourteen are placed in the Intermediate School, Instead of being divided into grades, each under a class teacher, the Intermediate School is arranged into eight rotating groups which move from room to room or shop.

THE SENIOR SCHOOL.

The Senior School, comprising pupils from fifteen to twenty-one years of age, is likewise divided into eight rotating groups. Four of these groups during the morning and four during the afternoon session visit each day special academic classes in the social sciences (geography,

history, and civics) arithmetic and grammar, reading and liter-ature, English language and composition. There are also special classes for speech and speech-reading. During one or two periods per week each group receives instruction in art, rhythm, and business practice.

Intensive and specialized instruction is given in the Senior School. Courses in carpenter work, shoemaking and shoe-repairing, printing, baking, cleaning and pressing, barbering, caretaking, business, caretaking, business, commercial art, and farming are provided for the boys. Courses in dressmaking, fancy sewing, beauty parlour work, laundry work, cooking, general housework, business, and commercial art are pro-vided for the girls. The four groups which spend their mornings in the academic rooms, spend their afternoons in shop practice; the four afternoon academic groups attend the various shops during their morning periods.

At the present time there are 133 pupils in the Junior Department, 87 in the Inter-mediate Department and 73 in the Senior Department.

Several pupils receive High School Entrance certificates every year and during the succeeding year follow a course of study similar to work taken during the first year in a High School



TRENTON

Trenton is at the mouth of the Trent Canal on the Bay of Quinte. The population according to recent census is 7,050. Among the industries are a creosoting plant, cooperage, silverware factory, textile and paper mills and box factory.

Trenton has good transportation by water, rail and highway. Connection is made by water with all points on the Great Lakes, the St. Lawrence River and the Trent Canal. Three lines of railroad serve the town and provincial highways 2 and 33 intersect here.

Albert College

Belleville, Ontario

Albert College is a residential school for young people. In its present form it is new, but as an institution of higher learning it is old, with a long and notable history and a rich tradition. It was founded in 1857 by the Methodist Episcopal Church to provide for their sons and daughters a centre of higher education under Christian influences. From 1866 to 1885 it possessed university powers. After the union of the various Methodist bodies in 1884, Albert became incorporated with Victoria University, and since that time it has carried on its work as a secondary college in affiliation with the university. During its history, both as university and college, Albert has held a conspicuous place among the educational institutions of the Dominion. It includes among its graduates some of the distinguished men and women of Canada, and it has given to the foreign mission field many of its gifted students.

The old college has now given place to the new. In 1926 the college moved into the magnificent new buildings which had been erected on a new site, and at the same time took on its new character as a college for

young men and boys. In 1936, due to the many requests that came from prospective lady students who desired to take some of the special courses and at the same time avail themselves of the many privileges of residential life, the Board of Governors saw fit to set aside a separate residence for a limited number of young ladies. In the new the aim has been to preserve the best traditions of the old, while at the same time setting up those new ideals and adopting those new methods which represent the best in modern education.

Albert College stands in a unique relation to the United Church of Canada. It is the only United Church College in the Province of Ontario to which boys are admitted. It provides a residential school of the first class to which the people of the United Church

can send their sons and daughters. It serves as a preparatory school for numbers of candidates for the United Church ministry. But while a United Church institution, it is open to students of all denominations, and takes in any acceptable students who desire the same scholastic training as that given in the High Schools and Collegiate Institutes. The Masters have been chosen with special care and with a view to their fitness for residential life among young people. They reside in the building and have oversight over studies, study periods and residential life.

No history of Albert College can afford to omit reference to our Honour Roll of three hundred teachers and students, and twelve nursing sisters, who responded to the call of the Motherland in the Great War. "Albert" was represented on practically all the battle fronts of Europe. Twenty-eight made the supreme sacrifice, while eight received the Military Medal, seven the Military Cross, and three the Distinguished Service Order.

Our students have attained prominence in various walks of life. Some have achieved Parliamentary fame, both in Provincial Legislatures and in the Federal Government, and some in State Legislatures in U.S.A. But we rejoice most of all in that over sixty of our students are serving Christ in the foreign







Belleville Collegiate and *Horational School*

The Secondary School supported by the Public of Belleville and Vicinity.

The School in which in all probability the majority of the young people of this City and District will spend a number of years in preparation for further careers at other schools, colleges, universities or in

The annual registration in this school has grown to one thousand students and the teaching staff to thirty-five.

The courses include instruction in academic subjects, commercial subjects and technical subjects. The equipment is modern and adequate. The various shops are well supplied with good machinery.

The masters are all well qualified, have had considerable experience in imparting instruction and are all interested in the welfare of the young people in the various courses.

Graduates of this school have invariably done well at the various universities and have filled important positions in not only Belleville but in many places scattered over the Dominion. This School is inspected annually by at least a dozen Departmental Inspectors.

Careful attention is given to the health of the girls and boys and at all times they are supervised at both work and play.

Night School instruction has been given in this School for a number of years. In the past few years

it was discontinued but classes no doubt will be begun again this Fall.

The Managing Board of Education is comprised of representative men of this City and are devoting a great deal of time to the welfare of the Secondary School.

Twenty-five years in the History of Belleville Collegiate and Vocational School.

In 1912 the Belleville High School had two hundred and twenty pupils and six masters.

The accommodation consisted of the second floor of the Queen Victoria School, situated on the present Collegiate and Vocational School

There were five class rooms and a small laboratory. The building had no electric lights and no running water except in the laboratory.

The course of study was exclusively the work for junior matriculation and honour matriculation.

From the year 1912, there has been a gradual growth and with the building of new public school buildings, the whole of the Queen Victoria School was occupied by the High School. This provided four additional class rooms and a small assembly room.

time passed the assembly room was divided with class rooms. The stone building (the old grammar school) situated to the rear of the main building was used as an additional class room and household science room. The old parish hall belonging to St. Thomas Anglican Church was procured as an additional class room and later two class rooms were procured in the Y.M.C.A. building. In this way, seven or eight more class rooms were added to the original five rooms in 1912. The registration had grown to around four hundred pupils at the time the school accommodation had grown to eleven or twelve class rooms housed in four separate buildings.

In the short eight years since moving into the new building the registration has grown from four hundred to one thousand; in the twenty-five years from two hundred and twenty and six masters to a thousand students and thirty-five masters.

At the present time there are about four hundred new pupils start courses in the school

Night school work was started several years ago and proved a decided success and with improvement in general conditions, this work will be resumed this autumn.

Belleville is well equipped now, with four comparatively new public schools, St. Michael's Academy and the new Collegiate and Vocational building.

New courses of instruction will be started

in September, which will eventually result in pupils obtaining a Secondary Graduation Diploma at the end of four years and a Secondary School Graduation Diploma with honours at the end of a five year course. The old junior matriculation, honour matriculation, commercial and vocational certificates and diplomas will soon be a thing of the past.



51 YEARS OF STEADY EXPANSION

Golden anniversaries are always interesting, whether in domestic or business life. Among the progressive lumber and building supply concerns observing over 50 years of history are the Houston Co., Ltd., of Belleville, Ont., whose slogan for many years has been "Everything in the Construction of a building".

It was on April 1st, 1886, that the business was launched in Tweed, Ont., a prosperous village about 25 miles north of Belleville. The founders were the late Robert F. Houston and A. M. Van Dusen. Mr. Houston was a contractor by trade and had worked up a good connection around Madoc and Tweed. A steam sawmill was purchased by the firm and lumber in various sizes was turned out. In 1889 the partnership was discontinued and for 11 years Mr. Houston carried on alone. In 1900 he took his eldest son, John F., into partnership, and the firm became R. F. Houston and Son. In 1910 the company was incorporated and the present officers are: J. F. Houston

ton, president; F. E. Houston, first vicepresident and treasurer; and R. E. Houston, second vice-president and secretary.

The sons are well and worthily upholding the traditions and high business prin-iples of the venerable founder. Since the business was removed from Tweed to Belleville, eight years ago, expansion has been the watchword and now the company serves all parts of Hastings and Prince Edward Counties, as well as adjoining municipalities. Ten acres of land and six buildings in Belleville belonging to the Steel Co. of Canada, which had been idle for several years, were acquired and gradually the planing mill and woodworking plant were transferred from Tweed to the larger

centre and considerable new equipment added. In Tweed, the Houston Co. carried on a brick plant and also did contracting, but since removing to Belleville no construction work has been undertaken, while the firm have specialized in furnishing supplies to smaller dealers, contractors, farmers and others. The company say that there is nothing in the woodworking or building supply line which they cannot supply, and deliveries are made by motor truck over a wide territory.

The company do considerable advertising, not only in the daily and weekly press, but also use space on the side of their trucks for publicity purposes. These signs are changed frequently. The Houston Co. believe that all advertising should be of a timely character, and attention is called to the special services rendered. In October storm sash and doors are generally featured and in early spring screens and screen doors, windows, etc., as well as summer cottages, lawn and garden furniture, along with other allied lines.

All the woodworking equipment of the company is run by electricity and the buildings are well laid out. There are ample storage facilities and one structure is devoted exclusively to building supplies, with rooms fitted up for display of paints, varnish, stains, builders' hardware, etc.






