Report of the Road Committee on certain roads, asked to be taken over as County Roads.

1. 3rd concession of Tyndinaga, connecting Road No. 7, known as the Shannonville Road with Road No. 15, known as the Marysville Road, a distance of 7 miles. This road is now in good repair, re-surfaced with crushed stone. There are two small wooden bridges. Also part of the fifth and sixth concessions, connecting Road No. 6 at Read and continuing east by Read Church and school to connect with Road No. 7, at fifth con-

cession, a distance of 5 miles. As the Township will take back as Township road, that part of Road No. 6 from Road No. 7, at Blessington on the 4th concession, east 5 miles and north  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles to Read, this would increase the mileage in the County by  $5\frac{1}{2}$  miles, but would give a much more serviceable location for the County roads. As the Township of Tyendinaga is served with only a small mileage of King's Highway, we believe the Council should give consideration to this change.

2. A street in the Village of Bancroft, connecting Road No. 1, section 2, at Hastings street, going west across the county bridge to Station and connecting with Pandash Lake road and also with Road No. 1, Section 2, at Gordon Jones'.

As the now County street will be taken over by the Province in their proposed connection of No. 7 at Madoc with the Trans-Canada Highway at Pembroke, we would recommend that these other streets be included in the County System.

3. The extending of Road No. 1, Sec. 2, from Maynooth to Maynooth Station a distance of one mile, be also included in the County System.

4. When on the inspection of the north roads, the Reeve of Dungannon asked the Committee to inspect a road in the Township of Dungannon, which would connect the present county road at Detlar with the Government Road running from Bancroft to Denbigh at Bowen's Corners, a distance of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles. This road is in good repair with concrete bridge recently constructed. This is an important connection and would recommend that it be added to the County System as it serves a large traffic outside the Township.

We would ask the Council to pass the necessary by-laws, subject to the approval of

the Highways Department and to take effect January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1938, as no provisions are made to finance them this year.

### Report of the Roads & Bridges Committee

Shire Hall, Belleville  
June 16<sup>th</sup>, 1937

To His Honour, the Mayor,  
and Members of the County Council:-  
Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Roads and Bridges herewith present for your consideration and approval, their semi-annual report:-

The expenditures from Dec. 1, 1936, to May 31, 1937, were \$32,535.00, an increase of \$5850.00 over the preceding year. Snow removal costs last winter were \$3150.00, compared to \$9240.00 for the previous winter. This increase of expenditure this year, over last year, is made up in, mainly the work in Hollaston in building the new road to eliminate two railway crossings which cost \$7500.00. There will be a rebate to the County from the railway crossing fund of 40% of the above cost. The spring conditions were unusually bad and necessitated extra expense in road maintenance. In the months of April and May there was the largest number of men employed of any previous year. There has been grade improvement carried on in Sidney on a road on the east side of the river; in Thurlow on the 2<sup>nd</sup> concession; in Tyendinaga

on the north two concessions of road No. 6, in Rawdon on the Ridge Road; in Huntington on the Madoc and Monia Roads; in Hungerford, building a new section where there were three claims for accidents last winter on account of high water on the road. Grade improvement is now being made in Marmora and Madoc. In the north part of the County, from Madoc north, with the exception of Hollaston, there has been a very small expenditure, as we advised that the Province was taking over the road from Madoc to Maynooth, and as the section of the Faulkner Highway from Millbridge to L'Amable, will be completed this year, we did not think it advisable to spend much on the east road, as that traffic will use the new road when completed, and light maintenance work is all we feel justified in doing this season. We have planned to improve many dangerous curves and hills, and do some low cost paving, but the work will be quite limited on account of that the appropriations will not be sufficient to do what we would like to do.

After this year, the County will be in a better financial condition as the balance of the highway cost for 1934 (\$64,000.00) will be paid and we can then do more paving work without increasing the tax rate.

In 1938, the balance of the Madoc Road should be paved and, with the Faulkner Highway, completed, there will be a good through Highway to connect the County town with the north of our County.

Last week, six tanks of liquid dust-layer were applied on the roads, and two cars of calcium chloride used as a dust-layer; we expect to use one more car on the 5th concession of Sidney Township when the resurfacing is completed with crushed gravel; this will be finished by the end of the month. The cost of the dust-layer on the road will be about \$9,000.00.

Tenders were called for on the various materials, including power maintainer, purchased when approved by the Highways Department.

Your Committee was instructed to inspect

and report on certain roads in the Township of Tyendinaga, Bancroft Village, and the extending of the Maynooth road to the station. A separate report will be submitted on these roads.

He would recommend that a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  mill rate be levied for maintenance and construction on County Roads and Bridges for the year 1937.

### Report of the Finance & Public Property Committee.

Shire Hall, Belleville

June 17th, 1937.

To His Honour the Mayor,  
and Members of the County Council:-  
Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Finance & Public Property beg leave to submit the following report:-

All matters pertaining to County business coming before your Committee, also care of the buildings and property belonging to the County have had our very best attention.

Your Committee has met twice since January. At the February meeting certain matters referred to the Committee from the January Session were discussed. The matter of supporting Mr. Brennan, Hungerford, in the House of Providence, Kingston, was referred back to the County Council, and will be discussed at this session. The County Clerk was authorized to consult the Solicitor regarding the collection of \$374.12 indigent accounts for Monteagle & Herschel Townships, and the matter laid over until the next meeting of the Committee, when it was again referred back to the County Council.

As usual, at the February meeting, the Clerk and myself were authorized to buy the stationery for the various County offices. This stationery is let by tender.

The printing of the Auditor's Reports was also let by tender, and was given to the North Hastings Review, Madoc, theirs being the lowest tender, at \$1.20 per page. This is a saving of 20¢ per page over last year.

Since January, a total of \$10,064.52 of indigent accounts has been paid. This is approximately \$200 more than for the same period last year. You will notice, by this, that the indigent accounts are not decreasing, and we ask the co-operation of the entire Council in keeping these accounts to a minimum.

The notice that the receipts from Pedlar's licenses are still quite small. Up to date only one license has been issued by the Treasurer since the beginning of the year. He would ask that County Councillors bring this to the attention of their County Constables and have them cheque up on the Pedlars in their districts.

He would also urge that Councillors keep in mind the advisability of excessive grants.

At the meeting of the Committee held on May 4th, the Committee authorized the payment of the High School Accounts for 1936, as has been done previously, owing to the new Amendment of the School Law Amendment Act.

The drain from the cellar in Shire Hall to the storm sewer on Campbell street was completed early in the spring, and has made the cellar much drier. Usually in the spring the cellar was quite badly flooded, but this installation of this drain has overcome the drawback. The work was done by the Public Works Department of the City of Belleville, and cost \$75.60.

As you no doubt know, the Province has assumed the County's share of the Mothers' Allowance and Old Age Pensions accounts from the first of April, 1937. These will make a great saving, as these two accounts cost the County approximately \$45,000.00 a year.

Cement floors were installed in the corridors and the cells of the jail. Other than this, only ordinary repairs were done in any of the County buildings.

The cement walk, adjoining the Treasurer's residence has been badly broken up by trucks taking wood into the Court House yard, and has

been replaced.

At this time we wish to compliment Mr. Deneys, Mr. Haggerty and their staff for their co-operation and information throughout the year.

A list of general and exigent accounts paid by your Committee since last session is attached hereto and will be laid on the table for the information of the Council.
