"Vitam Feliciter Ducere"

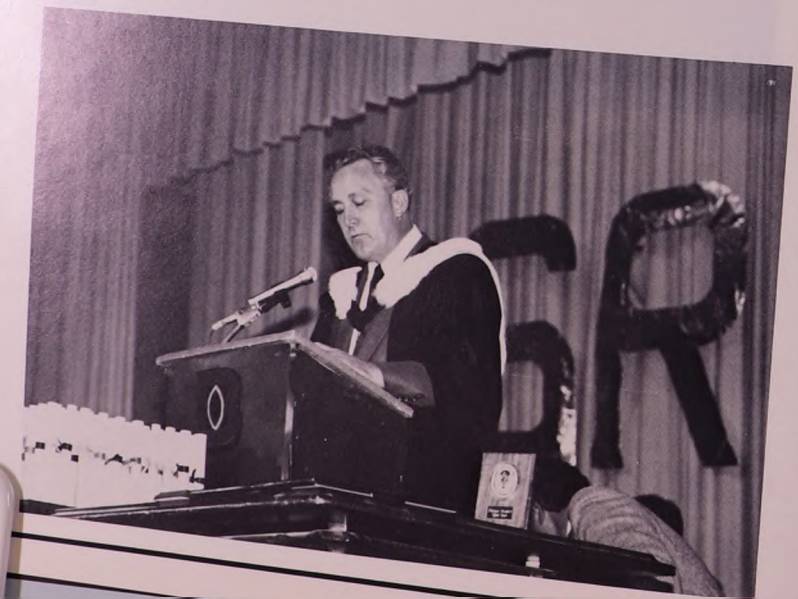

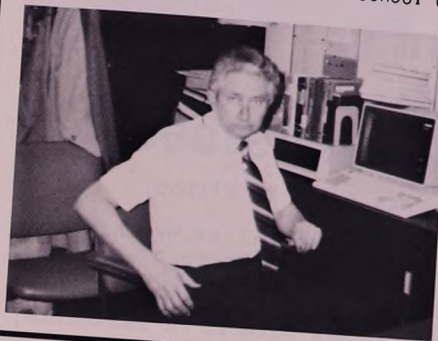


## VICE-PRINCIPALS MESSAGE

Tonight, as the graduating class prepares to meet its future, it also takes time out to visit the past for what may very well be the last time, and reminisce with old friends and favourite teachers.

But even though our homes in reality may be somewhere else, Belleville Collegiate will always linger in our mind as a secure haven in insecure times, a comfortable, familiar place to be when you're growing up. Also, for yet another year, BCI pitted itself against others, and besides enjoying its collected self it also placed near the top of the heap in

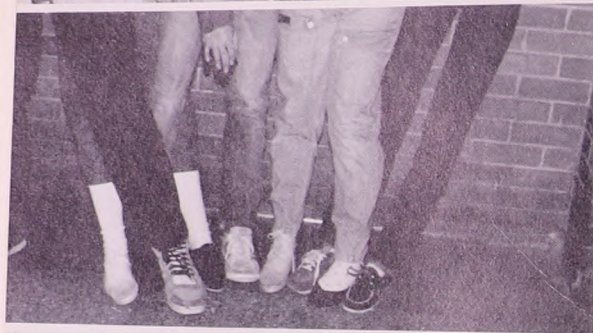

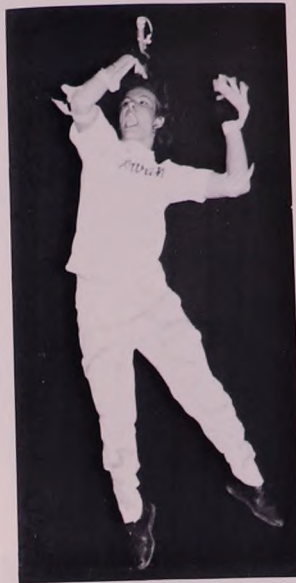
# Kampus Kapers
