"Beauty mate"is a common saying. "'Avego"(Have a go) is another,


"Bloke" is a man, and

"onight, as the graduating class prepares to meet its future, it also takes time out to visit the past for what may very well be the last time, and reminisce with old friends and favourite teachers.

But even though our homes in reality may be somewhere else. Pelleville Collegiate will always linger in our mind as a secure haven in insecure times, a comfortable, familiar place to be when you're growing up. Within these walls, we cemented friendships, accepted responsibility, and realized that teachers were neither true prophets nor true demons, but somewhere in

The students of BCI, when not studying continuously, did have time for other things. The past year was a flurry of activities of which everyone played a part. The year started in the usual way, with the seniors introducing the greenhorn grade nines to skills that would come in handy for the rest of their lives, like shaving balloons and blowing into plates of flour in search of pennies. The activities and the accolades are wonderful to receive, but the two aspects of this school I think are more impressive, are the contribution of the student population to their community at large, and the healthy attitude BCI presents. We used the proceeds of the carnival to maintain the Day Care Centre, which in turn was used to benefit those in the growing adult student population, who needed supervision of their youngsters to be able to attend classes. Money from our annual Slave Day went to our Christmas Wish Fund, which provided Christmas dinners to the needy in the area. There were more orders to fill this year, but BCI proved itself capable of handling the task. Our two exchange students, Jorg Reitmayer of West Germany and Lindsay White of Australia, showed all who met them that, while people from other countries can be different, in many ways we are still basically the same. And while headlines were being made over personnel changes this year, BCI sadly said goodbye to Mr. Walker and Mrs. Boyce, two individuals who left their marks in the efficient yet comfortable atmosphere of the school, but we openly welcomed Mr. Irwin and Mr. Melady's contributions as well.

Making a valedictory speech is extremely difficult because there is so much one wants to say about the school, its students and its faculty, that even if the speech was long enough to ensure the custodial staff extra overtime, things would still be left unsaid. But there are certain valuable lessons that were learned here that must be mentioned. First of all, the high academic standards at BCI that we students complained about at times. have proven to be invaluable as different university and college projects loom on the horizon. Secondly, we gained the confidence necessary to meet those challenges with a minimum of nailbiting. And finally and I think most importantly, the graduating class of '85 realized the unlimited capabilities of a group of people with a cause for which to strive. Without the grit and the mettle of varied individuals during my stay here who believed in the principles and the morals within this building there would be no commencement this evening, for there would be no school. I may forget my mark on my final English essay, but I will never forget that, no matter what the odds, you can beat city hall (no offence intended,

Mr. Zegouras). I will draw my speech to a close as there is a small group of graduates going to a party this evening. To sum it all up, a favourite singer of mine named Bruce (that's Springsteen, not Retallic) said that "Glory days will pass you by." That's one of the few times I've disagreed with him. My five years at BCIVS have taught me that, if you have no fear of failing to reach goals that others would label lofty; if you can brush yourself off and try again, if you momentarily fall from the path to your dreams; and if you understand that cynics only become prophets when people listen to them, then your glory will never






SLAVE DAY
