That the House of Refuge Committee be empowered to secure the services of a Superintendent and Matron at a joint salary not to exceed \$700. per annum.

That the land necessary to extend Bridge Street across the House of Peppin Farm of such width as the Committee thinks fit be sold to the Township of Thurlow for the purpose of a Highway at the same rate as paid for by the County and that we hereby authorize the Warden and Clerk to convey by due sale land to the Township of Thurlow and to attach the corporate seal to the deed, possession to be given to Thurlow when crop is removed.
