Report of the Finance & Public Property  
 Committee

Shire Hall, Belleville  
 June 12, 1935.

To His Honour the Sharden,  
 and Members of the County Council:  
 Gentlemen:

I, your Committee on Finance and Public Property, beg leave to submit the following report:

All matters under the jurisdiction of your Committee have had our best attention and the buildings and premises maintained, we trust, to your satisfaction.

At the January Session of the County Council, the matter of printing the Auditor's Reports was referred to your Committee. Tenders were called for and the contract awarded to the Tweed News for the printing of one hundred and seventy-five copies at a price of \$1.60 per page.

Your Committee has held only two meetings since the January Session, and at these meetings have dealt with indigent accounts as well as our usual work, instead of appointing a sub-committee on indigent accounts which would have added to committee-pay costs.

Hospital accounts totalling \$5,973.90 have been paid by your Committee out

of accounts totalling \$6,996.15 submitted for consideration. There is at present, on hand, accounts totalling approximately \$4,000.00 yet to be considered.

The members of our County Council have co-operated with the Clerk's Office in submitting information relative to patients from their Municipalities; your Committee has exercised the greatest care in considering these reports and all phases of each case submitted, before adjusting the account. It is drawn to your attention that there are many new accounts coming in, and we would recommend that strong representation be made for a reduction in the liability of the County for these accounts.

At a meeting of your Committee in February, it was decided to ask for tenders for the supply of stationery to the various County Offices for 1935; local printing offices to be given an opportunity of submitting quotations. It was indeed gratifying to find that the quotations submitted by our County printing offices compared very favourably with those of the outside firms and that the Chairman, in whose hands the matter was left, awarded the contract for practically all requirements to local offices.

The interior of the Court House and Gaol is in a fair state of repair, but your Committee would recommend repairs to the roof of the Court House and Shire Hall.

A writ was served against the County of Hastings, during the month of April, for payment of a hospital account of one, Lukian Mereszka, and at a meeting of the Finance Committee held during April, Mr. Payne was authorized to file a defense action against the suit pending in court.

At a meeting of the County Council held in January, the matter of certain lots owned by the County, and lying west of the city of Belleville, in the Township of Sidney, were referred to the Finance Committee with power

to act. At a meeting of the Committee held on April 25, it was decided that the County lots be fenced; also at the January Session, the matter of requesting the Finance Committee to approach the Bank with a view of having the interest rate reduced on the County's indebtedness. I might state that the Clerk and myself waited on Mr. Ilsey, Manager of the Canadian Bank of Commerce. He stated that it was impossible to give the County any better rate at the present time.

It is quite necessary that your Committee draw to your attention, the fact that a number of accounts are on the increase; such as Old Age Pensions and Mothers' Allowance.

Careful consideration has been given by your Committee to all necessary work and payment of accounts, with economy and the interests of the taxpayers foremost in our minds.

A list of general and Indigent accounts paid by your Committee since last Session is attached hereto and will be laid on the table for the information of the members of the Council.

Report of the Roads and Bridges  
Committee

Shire Hall, Belleville  
June 13, 1935

To His Honour the Steward;  
and Members of the County Council:  
Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Roads and Bridges herewith present their report on the progress of the work up to June 1, 1935.

The County Roads mileage has been increased, as five miles have been added to the system, from Springbrook west to connect with the County Roads in the adjoining County. Arrangements are being made for the purchase of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  acres of gravel pit at a price of \$225.00. This is located in the centre of the new County Road. Notice of the old Marmora-Madoc roads reverting back to the County, will be received soon and this will add 12 miles more to the County system. As this road serves many residents in Lawdon, Marmora, Madoc and Huntingdon Townships, and the Village of Deloro, it will require considerable maintenance, although it is left in good condition by the Provincial Department before turning it back and will not require much maintenance this season.

The find a large expenditure has to be used for bridge maintenance, as this work has been neglected for the past 4 years, more particularly the bridge painting. We were disappointed in that the arrangements with the Department of Northern Development for the maintenance of the Northern Roads, were not carried out, as we had hoped to reduce the tax rate this year.

30000 gallons of oil dust layer and 25 tons of calcium chloride have been purchased and the work of spraying, etc., will be completed by the end of this week. On March 12, a letter

was received, giving the County the privilege of continuing with the balance of the relief work left from 1934. The immediately reorganized the work, and 160 men <sup>were</sup> working the following day. This work was to continue until the end of March; \$25 36.90 was expended, giving labour to 241 labourers during the period. The  $\frac{2}{3}$  labour relief subsidy has been refused.

There are three crushers operating in stone and one in gravel at the present time with 271 men on the pay rolls. The have estimated for 34000 yds of stone and gravel to be put on the roads this season.

No provision is made for the construction of any new bridges, although the bridge at West Huntington, as it is at present, is very dangerous, and also the two sections of gravel road between the pavements. An additional  $\frac{1}{3}$  mill rate would do these two jobs. He would ask that the Council express themselves as to whether this should be done.

The expenditures for the past six months have been \$37,340.80; which exceeds 50% of the amount provided. The cheque for the subsidy on the 1934 work was received a short time ago by the Treasurer. Claims for damages on the County Roads have increased considerably this year. He could use, to a good advantage, a larger appropriation on the County system this year, in widening of grades and cutting down small hills which would reduce the accidents on our roads, but we are agreed that the taxpayers cannot provide additional taxes for that purpose this year, and greater precaution should be taken by the motorist and thereby reduce the accidents on our roads.
