Enclosed herewith I send you Agreement, Grace A. Craham to the Corporation of the City of Belleville for the converting of the buildings upon the Severn Property into a Vinegar Factory or other Manufactory by the end of 1906 or the payment of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars additional price of the property, executed by Mrs. Craham.

I also enclose you the Quit Claim Deed of the City's interest in the property.
