**FOX SIGHTINGS** This year a great number of foxes have been seen throughout all areas of Deseronto. The Town is working to live trap and relocate the animals with its contracted animal control services. Please ensure correct supervision outside. Children (or adults) should never get near a fox because of the risk of rabies. If taken by surprise or intervening in a situation with a fox, wave a big stick, shovel, etc., and/or make big, loud menacing actions and noises (pretend you are something like a big growling animal). Additionally, small pets (both dogs and cats) should never be outside without you right beside them (or within a high, secure fence) between the hours of dusk and full morning (i.e., 7:00 p.m. – 8:30 a.m.). If the animal poses an imminent danger to anyone, anywhere (e.g., chance of attacking or rabies), please call the police immediately (911)! If you see a fox that is not threatening please telephone and give the particulars to Deseronto Town Hall during regular office hours to help trap the animal (613-396-2440, Mon-Fri 8:30am - 4:30pm). If the situation occurs when the Town Hall is closed, please call the Town's animal control service providers Davies & Elliot directly (1-888-663-4443)—their services are available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. This will help with trapping the animals. **MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL** - Over the past several months the Recreation department, Council and staff have been working diligently to make improvements to our recreation programs while ensuring the residents of Deseronto cost effective services. Through these efforts, we are pleased to announce that the recreation department has made incredible progress in our efforts to reduce the impact on the municipal budget while continuing to make capital improvements to our facilities and services.

Most recently, thanks to *support* in contributions of community groups and local businesses we were able to provide much needed reconstruction to the Deseronto Ball Diamond. A celebration was held *on* May 25, 2009 to introduce "Whitley Field" to the community, and to publicly commend Whitley insurance (Telephone: 613 396 2312), The Deseronto Recreation Committee, Deseronto Legion branch 280 and numerous individuals responsible for completion of this project. Without their support and generous contributions, this project would not have proceeded. Secondly, it gives me great pleasure to announce the Town of Deseronto was successful in its application for a joint partnership grant from the Provincial and Federal government as part of the Build Canada stimulus Fund.. Our municipality received \$1.5 million dollars to be allocated for renovations to our community center. The intent of this grant is to expand the existing services offered at the facility to include, a larger more accessible banquet hall, and increased recreational opportunities and service capabilities. Tentatively, we should expect to see the first phase of this development begin in the spring of 2010.

With the school year now behind us, I would like to draw your attention to a few Recreation programs running within our municipality this summer. On July 16<sup>th</sup> we will be offering a Baby Sitters Course in the upstairs hall of the Community center. The program is open to anyone 11 years of age and older who may be interested and will run from 9am -4 pm at a cost of \$45.00 per attendee. The Deseronto Recreation Department will be operating a children's Day camp again this year. The program will run from the Community Centre, July 20<sup>th</sup> through to August 14<sup>th</sup> at a cost of \$110.00 per child per week and is open to any child from 6-12 years of age. The focus of this years programming will be to offer different weekly themes to address the variety of interests and needs of our youth. Themes range form Sports related to outdoor Adventurer weeks. These costs have increased from previous years but given a look at our schedule, your child will not be disappointed. Our goal is to provide an upbeat, educational week where the children will experience activities that they will talk about for the remainder of summer. Whether it be the Blue Jays games in week 1, the trip to Old Fort Henry, the Hell Holes caves and ravines in week 2, Wild Water Kingdom and the Sand Banks in Week 3 or the final week which offers a trip to the Peterborough Zoo and numerous activities. #### 2009 FINAL TAX BILLS ISSUED

Final Tax Bills for 2009 have been issued by the Town of Deseronto Treasury Department. If you have not received your bill, please contact the Town Hall at 613-396-2440 to request a copy. Installment due dates are: June 30<sup>th</sup> & Aug 31<sup>st</sup>.

### **WATER/SEWER RATE INCREASE**

Effective June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2009, the Town of Deseronto's Water/Sewer rates were increased by 4%. While it is not possible to avoid an increase (by provincial legislation water rates cannot be subsidized by taxes—so the system must be fully self-supporting) Council has passed a motion that there will be a public meeting prior to the end of the year to get input into a variety of rate structures options, e.g., a combination of some or no base fees. In the latter residents would only pay for each cubic meter of water used. Additionally, the Town is communicating with outside users to ensure that overages above contractual limits are appropriately compensated.



Ancestry is a tremendous resource for anyone researching people, holding, as it does, an enormous range of databases. For family historians, the ability to search across census information and immigration details can be of immense assistance in tracing the whereabouts of family members in the past. Ancestry Library Edition can only be accessed from within Ontario's public libraries. As Deseronto Archives is situated within Deseronto Public Library, we are very pleased to be able to make use of this service, which is already proving extremely useful in answering family history enquiries from our users. If you are having trouble with your family tree and haven't got a personal subscription to Ancestry, we highly recommend hot-footing it down to the library! Blowing our own trumpet ~ The progress we've been making in Deseronto Archives with sharing our images on the Internet and connecting with new users through our blog and Twitter accounts was shared with the Archives Association of Ontario through a presentation at their annual conference in June. This was a great opportunity to share what we've been doing with archivists from all over the province. Many of the other archivists were very interested in how we've been using these technologies to promote our work, so we may be seeing other Ontario archives starting similar programs in the next year or two.


