 Gentlemen:

We, your Committee on Roads & Bridges desire  
 to make a special report as follows:-

At the June Session of County Council, a motion  
 was passed, which stated that the matter of  
 dealing with the agreements regarding paving,  
 between Tweed, Madoc, Stirling and Frankford  
 Villages and Deseronto Town, be laid over until  
 the December Session, and the Reeves of the Mun-

icipalities involved, the former Road Superintendent and the Road Committee, be a Committee, be a Committee to investigate these agreements and report at the December Session.

At the meeting of the Roads & Bridges Committee in August, the Clerk was instructed to notify the Reeves of the Villages where paving had been done by the County at previous dates, to meet the Committee and lay their case before them, which was done.

The Committee after careful study of all details dealing with the cost of pavement in each case; the money spent in each village since the pavement was constructed, and the amounts paid into the County for county road purposes, decided upon a motion, moved by J. A. Bell and seconded by Geo. Thompson that this Committee recommend to the County Council at the regular session in December, that the paving agreements with the various villages within the County, be terminated at the end of the calendar year, ending December 31, 1938, when no further payments would be required on said pavement.

# Report of the Roads & Bridges Committee

Shire Hall, Belleville  
December 7th, 1938.

To His Honour, the Sheriff,  
and Members of the County Council:-  
Gentlemen:-

Your Committee on Roads & Bridges herewith present their report of operations and expenditures as prepared by your County Engineer with their approval for the fiscal year ending November 30th, 1938.

Our By-Law for proposed expenditures for the year was passed last January for \$91,400.00 and sent to the Department of Highways for approval. We were notified however, by the Department on April 28th last that the By-Law could be approved only to the amount of \$75,000.00. Consequently the rate of 2.0512 mills was struck to collect this amount.

## Expenditures

Total expenditures during the fiscal year, details of which are shown in the attached table, amounted to \$78,591.41, which leaves an unexpended balance of \$17.67.

### Re Additions & Deletions to County Road System:

In October approval was received from the Government of the deletion from the County System of the Gilmour (or Ridge Road) for a length of 5.2 miles, leaving still on the County Road System some 270 miles.

At the same date approval was given to the addition to the County system of the road known as James St. in the Village of Stirling (length approximately 400 ft) between County Road # 8, and Highway # 14.

No other by-laws still before the Department pertinent to both additions and deletions of certain roads to and from the County System have received Government approval this year.

### Re Crusher operations

All four crushers were operated last spring. The small crusher in the north did not crush a large amount for the County. The other small (and very old) crusher in Hungerford turned out such an unsatisfactory product, it was not used after June. Therefore the bulk of the crushed rock and gravel this year was the output of our two larger size (10 x 20) crushers.

Re Snow Removal Plans.

One carload of snow fence (12,000 ft) and the necessary posts were purchased this fall and are already erected. A few patrolmen still have no snow fence for their beats. Also many sections of road still have an inadequate supply and more should be purchased next year. Tenders have been called for operating trucks to do our plowing and contracts will be let shortly.

Re Paving Operations

A new pavement was laid (just under 1 mile in length) and the old 14 ft pavement was widened to 18 ft for 1/2 mile on that portion of County Road #11 between Delora Village and No. 7 Highway. Detailed costs of this work are furnished elsewhere. This pavement was of the retread type and what is known as a Tar mixed-in-place type of construction. After the crushed stone aggregate was placed along the side of the road the actual job was completed in 7 days, and results appear excellent.

Many of the old pavements on County Road in various Villages, were in need of a seal coat or "surface treatment. Lack of funds prevented all being treated this year, however, the following were done:

3/4 mile was done in the Town of Deseronto at a cost to the County of	\$574.88

1600 ft on Colborne St. in Tweed Village was sealed and crowned at a cost of	598.18

4-mil in Delora Village casting 149.16  
 1.95 miles of new work of this type was  
 constructed on Rd # 8 (Inson section) at a  
 cost of 1181.27  
 which incidentally works out to be exactly \$600.00  
 per mile.

The pavement in Marlbank, and at least  
 portions in Stirling and elsewhere will have to  
 be surface treated in 1939, to prevent serious  
 disintegration. Our Engineer believes more new  
 surface treatment mileage should be constructed  
 next year with a view to reducing maintenance  
 costs as well as providing a dust proof and more  
 permanent type of riding surface.

#### Re Power Maintenance

The two machines have operated 8 and 9 seasons  
 respectively. Both were driven to their limit  
 this season and have done excellent work. How-  
 ever, owing to their age, frequent breakdowns were  
 encountered necessitating loss of working time  
 and costly repairs. Both machines will have to  
 be given a thorough overhaul and rebuilt at the  
 factory or replaced next spring. Further it is the  
 considered opinion of our Engineer that the large  
 mileage we have, cannot be maintained in  
 reasonable shape with only two machines.

During the season cost of repairs and replace-  
 ment parts (on the two machines) amounted  
 to roughly \$1000.00. Of this new blades and  
 scarifier teeth cost \$225.00, sharpening teeth ran  
 \$230.00 and the balance (roughly \$450.00) was on  
 breakages which would not be excepted on  
 newer machines.

#### Miscellaneous Work

Five steel bridges were scraped and repainted.  
 Numerous curves and other signs have been erected  
 on over 20 miles of road and checkerboards placed  
 at more than a dozen dangerous corners and  
 over 400 guard rail posts (without cable) have  
 been erected on various roads. He would recommend  
 that more guard rail be erected.

A traffic census was taken on four of our more heavily travelled roads last July and August (Rds 5 A, 8, 16 and 1) with a view to ascertaining density and type of traffic so that we would be in a position to know which road should be hard surfaced first whenever paving seems necessary and advisable.

Details concerning mileage and costs on both snow roads and dust layers were given in our interim report on June 16<sup>th</sup> last, and so will not be repeated here.

A considerable mileage of new Hydro lines have been erected on our roads this year and the location of poles, anchors, guys, etc., have been approved or changed to meet the approval of our Engineer before erection.

A small amount of construction work only, such as straightening sharp corners, cutting down humps and blowing rock from narrow places (the latter being largely on the Coe Hill Road) could be done with the funds available other than the new pavement and two miles of surface treatment mentioned above. One timber bridge received major repairs and numerous old culverts were replaced with new pipe and one metal arch culvert was installed to replace an old wooden structure which failed.

# Report of the Advisory Agricultural Council

We, the Agricultural Advisory Council, wish to report as follows:

Our first meeting was held on May 26th with all members present.

Delegations from the Central Ontario Cheesemakers' Association and from the Belleville Fair Board were heard. A grant of \$100.00 was recommended as special prize money to the Empire Cheese Exhibit, to be held in Belleville during 1938. A grant of \$150.00 to Belleville Fair Board, and \$100.00 to each Fair within the County of Hastings were also recommended. These were brought before the Council at the June Session and were all ordered paid.

Our second meeting was held on November 16th, with all members again present. Mr. Fair, Agricultural Representative, read a report of the year's activities, and an itemized account of the expenditure of the County grants. Mr. Fair's work throughout the year has been excellent, and the report was very interesting to the members of the Committee.

We are informed that there is to be a course in Agriculture and Home Economics held in Stirling this winter, and we would urge all those who possibly can, to take advantage of this very excellent training.

To further this work, the Committee recommended that a grant of \$20,000 be given. This will come before the Council, and we may assure you that the money, if granted, will be used to the best advantage.

In the afternoon of November 16th, the Public Speaking Contest and presentation of prizes was held in the Council Chamber. There were nine contestants, seven girls and two boys.



The Harden's medal for the girls was presented to Marion Rose of Rawdon Township, for the boys to Ross Jeffs, also of Rawdon Township, and incidentally from the same school as Miss Rose.

The question of reforestation has often been before the Council, and it is a very important factor. I would again urge you to consider this matter and provide for some reforestation in the various townships.

### Report of the Publicity Committee

Shire Hall, Belleville  
 December 27th, 1938

To His Honour, the Harden,  
 and Members of the County Council:-  
 Gentlemen:

We, your Publicity Committee desire to report on the year's activities as follows:-

Your Committee has met twice this year, in February and in March.

At the first meeting in February, a deputation from the City of Belleville waited on the Committee with a proposal for a co-operative Publicity program between the City and the County. We had some folders, which had been prepared last year by the Picton Gazette and the Ontario Intelligencer, but which had not been paid for. We obtained these for a total cost of \$25.00 which was less than half of their original cost.



At the second meeting, prizes of \$5.00, \$3.00 and \$2.00 were offered for the best snapshots showing tourist attraction, these to be incorporated in a pamphlet in 1939. He felt that it was not the duty of the Committee to undertake the 1939 Publicity program, and so left the decision on the snapshots to next year's Committee. The Committee also voted \$5,000 towards the erection of signs at the East, West and North limits of the City of Belleville, the remainder to be contributed by the service clubs of the City, and the maintenance and lighting in future to be borne by the City of Belleville.

Advertisements were published in the local papers asking residents of the County who had cabins, summer resorts or any tourist attraction to communicate with the County Clerk, describing the same. The replies were incorporated in a small pamphlet and attached to the folders which we had this year, and distributed to various places, and by the Belleville Chamber of Commerce.

A sum of \$15.00 was paid to the Tweed News for advertising in that paper in the Old Home Week edition. He believe this was a good investment as this edition was sent to parties all over Canada and United States. The City of Belleville did not assist in this advertisement.

### Report of the Finance & Public Property Committee

Shire Hall, Belleville  
December 9th, 1938

To His Honour, the Sheriff,  
and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen:

We, your Committee on Finance & Public Property,  
beg leave to report as follows.

Your Committee has met twice since June.  
All matters pertaining to County business  
and property coming before your Committee to-  
gether with the buildings belonging to the County,  
have had our best attention.

At our first meeting, held on August 11th, the  
question of County insurance was dealt with. The  
A. E. Wilson Co., had approached the Committee with  
the suggestion that the insurance be brokered  
through that company, but the Committee decided  
to let it remain with Haig Bras, Belleville, and

that it be distributed as follows:

Mr. Martin	27.7%
Mr. Naylor	19.2%
Haig Bros	18.7%
Bateman & Docter	19.5%
J. A. Steckle	8.1%
Mr. Gladney	6.8%

In the Registry Office it was found necessary to do considerable book binding. Mr. Draycott, a local man, was employed to do this, and the total account was \$725.91. Some new filing equipment to the amount of \$115.00 was also purchased for the Registry office.

Also at this meeting the Clerk was authorized to call for tenders for the supply of coal and wood. The tenders were opened and considered by the Clerk and myself and 200 cords of wood at \$7.50 per cord delivered at the Court House and 30 tons of coal at \$13.25 per ton, delivered, were purchased.

At this meeting \$5,648.58 was paid to 14 hospitals for indigent accounts. However, this amount included the last of the Consumptive Hospital accounts. As you know, the Provincial Government assumed this cost from June 30th, 1938. At the second meeting a total of \$5200.05 was paid which included a number of outstanding accounts as far back as 1934 for which the hospital was pressing payment. This makes a total of around \$25,000.00 of indigent accounts for the year, which you will readily see is considerable.

At our second meeting, held October 28th, the night fireman for the County buildings was hired at a salary of \$1,250 per week.

The lately purchased 15 cots for use in the jail, for the sum of \$75.00. These were bought locally from Thompson Furniture Store. A small amount of plastering has been done at the jail lately, but there has not been any great amount of repair work done in the Court House or jail this year.

You will note that the ceiling in the Council

Chamber has been repaired. He had this done by Mr. Vanderwater for a very small sum, and believe the work is quite satisfactory and will stand up for some time.

At this time, we wish to thank Mr. Henry, Mr. Haggerty and their staff for the co. operation and assistance received throughout the year.

A list of general and indigent accounts paid by your Committee since the June Session is attached hereto and will be laid on the table for your consideration.
