Belleville April 13th 1853

Council met by call from the Warden for Special Business.

The Council met pursuant to Call of the Warden, for the purpose of taking the necessary Steps to raise Money on the Consolidated Municipal Loan Fund, and for the disposing of the Various accounts before the Council.

Introduction of By Law to raise a certain sum of Money on credit of Consolidated Municipal Loan Fund for making and improving Roads in County.

Mr Frizzell introduced a By-law intituled a By-law to authorise the sum of _____ thousand pounds, to be raised on the Credit of the Consolidated Municipal Loan Fund of Upper Canada, to be appropriated in making and improving the Roads in the County of Hastings
